One-day Beekeeping Class

Humans has been eating honey for over 15,000 years. Beekeeping has been developing as an art for the past 12,000 years and has evolved from a hollow log to more specialized hives. The art of beekeeping is slowly disappearing in America, due to many different factors, including mites, imported honey and other hobbies.

Colony Collapse Disease (CCD) is a in the news almost every day now. One of the best ways to help the bee population is to keep bees in backyards. This class aims to provide an introduction to beekeeping to show you what it is like to keep bees.



The class will take place in two parts. The first part will be more 'classroom' learning. We will be learning about the life of bees, their social structure, and some of the less technical parts of beekeeping. The second part will take place after lunch and we will be opening up hives to discover what is happening inside the hives.
